






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














8. Pull Weeds and Plant Flowers

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What is an Instructional Ecosystem?

- A cohesive suite of resources that aligns to the evidence, has efficacy, and is designed to meet learning targets.
- Instruction that is aligned across Tiers of Instruction to maximize outcomes for students.



Advantages of an Ecosystem Approach					
Academic Language	Focused Instruction	Routines	Efficiency of Teaching	Quality	
Consistency of academic language across all Tiers.	Scope and sequence of skills is the same; intensity of instruction differs.	Consistency of instructional routines allows for students to focus cognitive energy from process to learning.	Consistency of instructional routines allows teachers to focus on student response.	Provides a suite of proven products from a trusted source.


Action Steps

- 1. Have honest and relentless conversations about data.
- 2. Be clear on learning goals for all students.
- 3. Screen, diagnose, and progress monitor with effective, efficient assessments.
- 4. Chose Tier One resources with evidence alignment and efficacy research.
- 5. Plan targeted interventions based on diagnostic assessments; provide more time, intensity, and focus on instruction for Tiers Two and Three.

- 6. Plan extended learning and enrichment for students above benchmark.
- 7. Take stock of all instructional resources being used, and
- 8. Use resources that are efficient, efficacious, and aligned in an instructional ecosystem.
- Focus professional learning that is consistent with universal goals yet differentiated for individuals.
- 10. Keep moving forward and plan for the future.
