Known at the time as the Learning Development Center, we served 13 students.


Our dream was to serve many more.

We've done that by growing our school, summer, and tutoring programs locally, delivering presentations and workshops for parents and educators nationally, and providing training to thousands of public and private school teachers worldwide so they can put our proven methods into action.

Another innovative approach from Hill: developing training, curriculum, and technology to make the Hill Reading Achievement Program (HillRAP) available to students and teachers everywhere.

The Birth of HillRAP

The Hill Reading Achievement Program (HillRAP) is a structured literacy program designed by teachers at Hill Learning Center and refined over more than four decades. It is based on the scientific understanding that for students who learn differently, reading must be taught systematically to effectively build their skills — and their confidence. For teachers, it provides them with the data and tools they need to target instruction to a student's specific needs and make effective use of limited instructional time. For years, this groundbreaking program was limited to the students that Hill could reach locally.

Our goal: to provide teachers anywhere with a program proven to help students with persistent reading difficulties.

While its roots and use in our school go back to our founding, "HillRAP" was born around 2000 when we started training teachers beyond Hill in our reading methodology. Our goal: to provide teachers anywhere with a program proven to help students with persistent reading difficulties, including dyslexia. Grants enabled us to pilot HillRAP in North Carolina public schools, engage researchers as evaluators, and develop an internationally accredited professional development program for teachers.

Independent research across multiple school districts has shown that HillRAP helps students improve at faster rates than "average" students. Just as important, teachers and students consistently report that HillRAP students grow more confident and engaged as they experience success.







The Rise of HillRAP

HillRAP has grown exponentially. We've trained more than 4,000 teachers across America and around the world and developed partnerships with schools and school districts to make HillRAP a focal point of their approach to reading intervention.

Along the way, with generous philanthropic support and countless collaborators, we've continued investing in HillRAP to make it easier to learn, use, and access.

We launched an iPad app in 2015, placing HillRAP's content, data, and distinctive methodology at the fingertips of teachers and students. To accommodate the demand for remote learning during the pandemic, we transformed our training and instructional app to work remotely. Then we introduced a web-based application in 2022, making HillRAP available on all devices and ensuring any teacher or student with access to the internet can use the program.

With every innovation, Hill's trainers, teachers, and students led the way. And at every step, we benefited from the expertise and collaboration of other HillRAP users; development partners, including ITI Technologies, SAS Curriculum Pathways, Code the Dream, and The Farthest Pixel; and experts and researchers at Duke, UNC-Charlotte, UNC-Wilmington, Research Triangle Institute, the Friday Institute at NC State, and the Florida Center for Reading Research.



Extending Our Reach

We have long recognized that HillRAP is a gem. Research shows it is remarkably effective at helping students meaningfully improve their reading skills, and there are an endless number of positive testimonials from teachers, students, and their parents singing the program's praises. Effective use of instructional time is more important than ever, especially for those students who are struggling and behind, and HillRAP enables just that.

But as a small nonprofit that first and foremost operates a school, there have always been limits on our capacity to grow HillRAP. To expand its reach, Hill sought a partner who shares our values and mission to help students who are struggling to read succeed.

We found the perfect match in 95 Percent Group, an established education company with a national reach. It has the resources and expertise to expand HillRAP to more schools and more students while investing in research and technology to make HillRAP even better.

One of our dreams has always been to reach as many students as possible.

With HillRAP now on the cusp of reaching its full potential, we are filled with pride. This partnership allows HillRAP to flourish nationally while we focus on working more locally with students and teachers.


